

The local area is utilised to achieve the desired outcomes, with opportunities for learning outside.

Cross curricular outcomes in geography are specifically planned for, with strong links between geography, history and morning literacy lessons identified, planned for and utilised. the classroom embedded in practice.

At Lightmoor Village Primary School, the John Muir award is used to explore and improve the quality of local wild places, encouraging the students and teachers to engage with, value and take ownership of their own natural environment.

The residential trip to Arthog Outdoor Education Centre allows children the opportunity to develop a greater understanding of their self, other people and the environment and how they are all intertwined.

## Geography at Lightmoor



What does it look like?

The children have access to a number of geographical resources, such as google maps, atlases and local ordinance survey maps from Historic England to help them find the information they need for their enquiries.

Everyday, KS2 children watch the 5 minute CBBC program Newsround to gain a deeper understanding of the wider world outside of Telford.

Throughout their time at Lightmoor Village Primary School, the children develop an understanding of the physical and human geography of their local area through field studies and the geographical resources listed above. Furthermore, enquires such as 'How has Lightmoor changed?' encourage the children to look at the heritage of their local area which go on to fuel more enquires.
